**NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY  
FOR  
OKLAHOMA CITY SOCIAL SERVICES GRANT 2017-2018**

**Introduction:**

The City of Oklahoma City Planning Department Housing and Community Development Division (City) is soliciting proposals from experienced service providers for 2017-18 Social Services Grant funds in an estimated amount of \$121,000 for the provision of social services to the community to be funded from the City's FY 2017-18 General Fund Budget. Grants awarded after July 1, 2017, may be made retroactive to that date. All grant awards are subject to the availability of funds.

Applicants may submit proposals for all or part of the available funding under this solicitation. Submittals may be made electronically during the period **starting 1:00 pm July 14, 2017 and ending 5:00 pm July 28, 2017**

A technical assistance/question & answer session will be held **July 14, 2017 from 10:00 am to 11:00 am** in the **EMBARK Large Conference Room, 431 W. Main Street, Suite B**. Attendance is **required** for all applicants.

The City will review each proposal in regard to conformance with the guidelines outlined below. This solicitation outlines the type of programs requested and criteria that must be followed by each entity wishing to be considered for funding. Applicants can apply for all or part of the funds available. Social Services funding is for one year. Available funds are drawn on a reimbursement basis.

Applicants will be notified by **August 1, 2017** of the time to answer any questions about their proposal for the Continuum of Care Board. The Board will meet on **August 4, 2017** in the Planning Department conference room, 420 W. Main, Suite 900. The Continuum of Care Board will make recommendations for funding. These recommendations will be presented to the Social Services Committee of the City Council on **August 15, 2017** (Executive Conference Room, 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, 200 North Walker at 8:00 am) for its recommendations before being presented to the City Council for final approval.

Applicants with projects approved for funding will enter into an Operating Agreement, which will define the requirements of the Social Services program.

### Section I. Eligible Applicants:

Applicants **must be private nonprofit (registered 501c3) organizations** and must demonstrate sufficient experience for the proposed activity or project and must have current capacity to administer and carry out this project.

### Section II. Program Goals:

Meets an underserved community need  
Provides critical services (legal, housing, HMIS, case management, assistance to homeless persons)  
95% of the funds must be used within the Oklahoma City limits.

### Section III. Available Funding:

\$121,000

### Section IV. Proposal Submission:

The CITY reserves the right to request other project-related information at any time during the proposal review process.
